

PARENT'S CODE OF CONDUCT

-Parents are to read and understand the Code of Conduct and help support, follow and endorse them.

-Code of conduct form must be signed and returned to the head coach before July 31, 2010. Failure to do so result in your child not being allowed to participate.

-Parents will show good sportsmanship and respect to coaches, players, other teams, other parent's and game officials at all times.

- ◆ Parents are encouraged to cheer on their team's players and show good sportsmanship for good play of other opponents.
- ◆ No parent shall curse, swear or use any bad language during practices or games.
- ◆ No parent will argue with other parents, coaches, other team players or officials.
- ◆ Parents will remain in self-control at all times.
- ◆ Disrespect to any coach, other parents, opponents or officials will not be acceptable (praise in public address concerns in private).

-Parents are encouraged to talk with coaches if they have questions or concerns about the program. These conversations should be conducted in the following manner.

- ◆ Always private.
- ◆ Always professional.
- ◆ Always with the player and team as the focal point.
- ◆ Parents are encouraged to allow 24 hours cooling off period to pass prior to confronting coaches with issues.
- ◆ Talking directly to coaches about concerns is always preferred if the above elements are followed. If are not comfortable talking directly to the coaches please contact a board member and we will help.

-Players are expected to attend football practices and games. Parents are to make arrangements to have players dropped off prior to the start time of practice or game and picked up immediately after practices and games are concluded.

-The West Kendall Optimist Youth Football program understands that school and grades come before football. Any request made to our coaches, by parents about a player's school activities, grades and homework will be fully supported. Our goal is that players be good students and role models in school and in our community.

-Parents are asked to assist in cleaning up the stands and field after the last game.

-If the league imposes sanctions for any infraction, the person receiving the infraction must pay the fine for that infraction. Failure to pay said fine could affect your child's participation status for the remaining part of the season and/or next season.

-I have read and understand all of the above. I understand that failure to abide by these guidelines could result in the parent being asked to leave the practice or game. Continued disregard of the program guidelines, may result in the player of the parent being removed from the program.

-The West Kendall Optimist Youth Football Program appreciates your support. This program is designed for our kids and win or lose it needs to be fun for all.
